Leading a Small Group Through The Beauty of Partnership

The *Beauty of Partnership* is designed for followers of Christ who want to gain the skills for successful cross-cultural partnerships. You may go through the learning journey on your own, but we believe that the process will be more enjoyable and impactful if you do it with others. You'll receive the same content as the individual course, but this will create a private space for you and your group to share reflections and grow together.

This guide will help you navigate through the process of leading a group through the *Beauty of Partnership*.

Set up a Cohort with Mission ONE

Before leading a group through the *Beauty of Partnership*, our team must set you up with a cohort inside of the course platform. Before you begin, please email us at info@mission1.org so that we can send you an invitation to facilitate a cohort.

You will have the opportunity to prepay for any participants in your cohort. Otherwise, each participant can pay for their registration individually upon invitation. There is no limit to the number of participants you can have in your cohort.

From there, you'll sign up for an account with your email address and create a password.

Review the Course for Leading a Cohort

Once you've been invited to lead a cohort, you can find everything you need in the digital course [Teaching with Cohorts](#). Review each of the

modules and create a plan for moving your group through the *Beauty of Partnership*.

Invite Participants to the Course

Once you've reviewed the material on how to facilitate the *Beauty of Partnership*, it's time to invite participants. You'll be able to invite participants by sending them an invitation email or by sharing the invitation link provided in the cohort settings.

If you prepaid, any group members added after the prepaid number have joined will be asked to pay for their own registration.

Determine a Timeline

Once you've invited all your participants, we suggest that you arrange a meeting virtually or in person to set the timeline for the course, make sure everyone feel supported, and establish when and how you'll check in with them to make sure they're getting the most out of the material. We suggest that you establish regular meetings times with your group so you can all share what you're learning collectively. The course will take 6 weeks to complete, so we suggest a weekly meeting to offer points of discussion and community.
